It is the site of Spanish government and is the most important financial and cultural center in the country. The cultural, leisure and sports offering is rich and varied. Arrival in Madrid: The Adolfo Suárez Madrid-Barajas Airport is located some 12 kms away. There is access to the city by bus, metro or taxi.
