

INTERNATIONAL CRIMINAL LAW

Credits: 3 ECTS.

Description:

The course provides basic information regarding substantive international criminal law and international criminal procedure. Likewise, the latter seeks to promote knowledge with reference to essential aspects of international cooperation in criminal matters with the aim of fostering commitment in international and transnational professional practice.

Programme of the course:

Block 1: Introduction to International Criminal Law

1. Basis of International Law
2. General Principles of International Criminal Law

Block 2: International Criminal Courts

1. The Courts of Nuremberg and Tokyo.
2. International Criminal Courts Ad hoc.
3. International Criminal Court

Block 3: International Cooperation

1. Mechanisms of International Cooperation
