PROFILE

The *Universidad Pontificia Comillas*, also referred as Comillas, is a private Catholic higher education institution that combines a long history of experience in education, academic excellence and a humanistic tradition in teaching, with a commitment to continuous modernisation, stimulated by new social and cultural challenges. The university was originally founded in 1890 by Pope Leo XIII and is run by the Society of Jesus.

Comillas is involved in a great number of academic exchange programmes, work practice schemes and international projects with over 200 institutions of higher education in Europe, Latin America, North America, Africa and Asia.

The Faculty of Law (ICADE) is one of Europe's most acclaimed business-oriented law schools, having played a pioneering role in the implementation of Double/Dual Degree Programs in Spain. For example, an International Doble Degree: E-1 JGP + LL.M and a Nanterre). Our main goal is to educate and train exceptional professionals, and even better people, orientated towards placing their professional skills at the service of society. Thus, exchange students will have the opportunity to choose from a wide array of courses in areas such as public international law, private law, information technology and communications law, and law and management and business administration. Students may choose to take all courses in English or to take a mix of English and Spanish-taught courses. They can also attend a tuition-free Spanish language course while enrolled in law classes.

Academic Calendar

Academic year 2024-25 (subject to changes):

First/Fall semester:

- Compulsory Orientation Sessions: 29th August.
- Specific Orientation Session for Law exchange students only: 29th August. Compulsory face-toface meeting.
- Classes: 2nd September 6th December.
- Examination period:
 - 9th-20th December (Fall semester students only)
 - 9th December 12th January (Full year students)
- Christmas break: 23rd December 7th January

Second/Spring semester 2024-25:

- <u>Compulsory Orientation Sessions</u>: 9th and 10th January.
- Classes: 13th January 25th April.
- Easter Week: 12th April 21st April.
- Examination period: 28th April 21st May.
- Resit exam period: 9th June 27th June.

Examination timetables are made available around week 8 of the semester. Do not plan your travel back before your last exam, no exception will be made.

Language of Instruction and Requirements

- Spanish level B1 (B2 recommended) for courses taught in Spanish.
- English level B1 (B2 recommended) for courses taught in English.

We do not need to see the test results but ask all our partners to make sure their students have this level before nominating them.

Academic Workload

Max. 36 credits (ECTS) per semester. 1 ECTS credit is equivalent to 25 working hours. Exchange students usually take 20-25 ECTS per semester.

Attendance

Attendance to at least 80 % of classes is mandatory. Schedule overlap is not allowed due to absence policy.

Courses Pre-Registration and Official Enrollment

Phase II – Pre-registration Courses (before the mobility): The student will receive an e-mail in July (for the fall semester) and December (for the spring semester) with the dates to pre-register for their courses.

<u>Phase III-Enrolment (upon arrival)</u>: Proof of health insurance must be uploaded to the online application and the data must be completed before submitting the registration. Please bear in mind that no student will be allowed to enrol without showing proof of health insurance.

Application deadlines for Phases II and III:

- First/Fall semester: 13th September.
- Second/Spring semester: 24th January.

Student Exchange at Comillas - Admission

STEP 1. Nomination from Partners:

Deadlines:

Fall semester or full academic year:

- 1st May (non-EU students)
- 1st June (EU students)

Spring semester:

- 1st October (non-EU students)
- 1st November (EU students)

STEP 2. Online Application: Nominated students will receive an email with instructions on how to apply, as well as their username and password.

Phase I - Admission: Fill out the online application and upload a passport-size photo and a copy of your valid passport or ID.

Deadlines for Phase I: First/Fall semester: 30th June. Second/Spring semester: 15th November.

STEP 3. Acceptance: Once Phase I has been completed Comillas University will confirm the admission to the student by e-mail and will send additional information about Orientation Days, Spanish courses, etc.

Non-EU students will receive an acceptance letter to apply for the **student visa**. They must apply for it personally at the <u>Spanish Consulate or Embassy</u> in their home country.

Course Catalogue for Exchange Students

Exchange students can also apply for our <u>Diploma in Legal</u> Studies in Spain

Students are not allowed to mix courses from other Faculties. The final acceptance for a particular course is subject to availability. Postgraduate courses are restricted to partners with specific agreements.

Important: While every effort is made to enrol exchange students on their preferred courses, it cannot be guaranteed. Exchange students are urged to be flexible. English courses may fill up quickly.



Spanish Language Course (free)

Español Lengua Extranjera (Spanish for exchange students), 6 ECTS distributed throughout the term. This course is free and optional.

Levels: A1, A2, B1, B2 and C1.

<u>Level test</u>: students must take a level test. They will receive an email in July or December with instructions on how to take the test online. Those that do not take the test on time are not guaranteed a place.

If a student needs credits for this course, he/she must include it in the enrolment sheet.

Transcript of Records

Transcripts shall be sent directly to the coordinator of the home University by email at the end of February for Fall semester students and at the end of July for annual and Spring semester students.

The documents that are electronically signed by the General Registry of the *Universidad Pontificia Comillas* include a secure verification code (CSV as per the Spanish) that allows them to be downloaded online. Further information

Students can also check their grades on their intranet.

Spanish Grading System

Each subject is graded on a scale of 0 to 10 points. Fail: 0-4.9; Pass-good: 5-6.9; Very good: 7-8.9; Outstanding: 9-10; Dean's list: Recognition of academic excellence. To pass a subject it is necessary to achieve at least 5.0 points.

Exchange students must have comprehensive health and liability insurance before their arrival at Comillas and valid for the entire period of their stay in Spain. The student must provide proof of the insurance to the exchange coordinator upon arrival.

Students from the European Union and the European Economic Space (Norway, Iceland and Liechtenstein as well as Switzerland, must bring their European Health Card with them.
