

# Newcomb-Tulane College (NTC)

# NTC Requirements

In addition to Freeman's non-business prerequisite and major required courses, and ICADE-required courses, you will need to complete:

- Minimum 62 credits total at Tulane; about 15-16 credits or 5-6 classes per semester
- ENGL1010 (Writing) or ENGL1011 (Writing for Academic Purposes; non-native speakers)
- Laboratory Science
- One course to complete the "Textual and Historical Perspectives" requirement
- A 3000-level or higher course with a public service element (may overlap with another requirement)
- A course that fulfills the "Aesthetics and Creative Arts" requirement
- A course that fulfills the "Race and Inclusion" requirement (may overlap with "Text/Historic" or "Aesthetics/Creative Arts" requirement)

# Service Learning

Tier-2 service learning options must be completed with an upper-level course (3000-level or higher).

#### **Service Learning Course**

Academic Service Learning is an educational experience based upon a collaborative partnership between the university and the community. "Learning by doing" enables students to apply academic knowledge and critical thinking skills to meet genuine community needs. Through reflection and assessment, students gain deeper understanding of course content and the importance of civic engagement.

Placed at numerous sites throughout the city for a variety of courses, students spend 20 or 40 hours (depending on the class) completing their service throughout the semester. For more information, please contact Bridget Smith.

#### **Public Service Internship Program**

The second module focuses on deterministic modeling, including decision-making under certainty, and the use of optimization models such as linear programming.


