Course Aims

The course has been designed to provide students with a general knowledge of Spain's literary development through various genres and styles from the Middle Ages until the present. By reading selections of some of the canonical Spanish literary texts, students will gain an understanding of key features of Spanish society and culture, as reflected in its literary production. Works will be examined in their cultural and historical context.

Intended Learning Outcomes: On successful completion of this course, students will achieve:

- A knowledge and understanding of Spain through literature
- A knowledge of the canonical literary texts and their authors as producers of meaning and ideological debate
- A knowledge and understanding of the different literary movements
- An understanding of the relationship between literary works and their reception
- A knowledge of the elements of literary analysis
- An awareness of the relationship among the different artistic products of an epoch
- An understanding of the interplay between literary works and the historical and sociological conditions under which the works were produced
- Intellectual skills to conduct a critical analysis of textual production and problems, identifying essential issues and controversies
- Conceptual thinking, grasping concepts at work in the different texts
- Construct a reasoned argument supported by the evidence of the works
- Practical skills to communicate effectively
- Practical skills to plan, undertake and report research of a non-quantitative nature, making use of the works studied and other type of sources

Course content: the following works, authors, and literary movements will be discussed:

- Poem of the Cid
- Fernando de Rojas: La Celestina
- The Revolution of Poetry: Garcilaso de la Vega and the Renaissance
- The subversive voice of *Lazarillo de Tormes:* A Selfie with words
- Living is Reading: Don Quijote de la Mancha and the new Information Technologies
- Baroque Poetry
- World as Theater, Theater as World: the birth of virtual reality in the Spanish Baroque
- Enlightenment in Spain
- A Late Romanticism: the Myth of Don Juan
- Realism and the crisis of 1898: Miguel de Unamuno's *Niebla* and the problem of identity
- Innovation and Tradition in the Generation of 1927: Federico García Lorca's La casa de Bernarda Alba
- The Latin American "Boom"
- Spanish Literature Today
